## Acts 1:8 – Power Principle

The Holy Spirit will give you the ability to tell what you have experienced every where you go - with miraculous results!!!!

#### The Antioch Declaration Acts 13

- <sup>38</sup> Therefore let it be known to you, brethren, that through <sup>[p]</sup>Him forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you,
- <sup>39</sup> and <sup>[q]</sup>through Him <u>everyone who</u>
  <u>believes</u> is <sup>[r]</sup>freed <sup>[s]</sup>from all things,
  from which you could not be <sup>[t]</sup>freed
  <sup>[u]</sup>through the Law of Moses.
- Continue in the Grace of God (43)
- Preached to Jewish audiences



#### Acts 17 - Recent Events Recap

- <sup>5</sup> Thessalonica , <u>"These men who have upset [g]the</u> world (*i.e., turned it upside down*) have come here also; <sup>7</sup> [h]and Jason has welcomed them, and <u>they all</u> act contrary to the decrees of Caesar, saying that there is another king, Jesus."
- Berea many of them believed, [m]along with a number of prominent Greek women and men.
- Jews of Thessalonica found out that the word of God had been proclaimed by Paul in Berea also, they came there as well, agitating and stirring up the crowds.
  <sup>14</sup> Then immediately the brethren sent Paul out to go as far as the sea; and Silas and Timothy remained there.
  <sup>15</sup> Now those who escorted Paul brought him as far as Athens

#### "Energizer" Evangelist

- <sup>16</sup> Now while Paul was waiting for them at Athens, his spirit was being provoked within him as he was observing the city full of idols. <sup>17</sup> So he was reasoning in the synagogue with the Jews and the God-fearing *Gentiles*, and in the market place every day with those who happened to be present.
- <sup>18</sup> And also some of the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers were <sup>[n]</sup>conversing with him. Some were saying, "What would this <sup>[o]</sup>idle babbler wish to say?" Others, "He seems to be a proclaimer of strange deities,"—because he was preaching Jesus and the resurrection.

## Girl Friend, Spill It

- And they took him and brought him <sup>[p]</sup>to the <sup>[g]</sup>Areopagus, saying, "May we know what this new teaching is <sup>[r]</sup>which you are proclaiming? <sup>20</sup> For you are bringing some strange (new/unfamiliar) things to our ears; so we want to know what these things mean.
- "<sup>21</sup> (Now all the Athenians and the strangers visiting there used to spend their time in nothing other than telling or hearing something new.)

### Sermon on Mars Hill

- <sup>22</sup> So Paul stood in the midst of the <sup>[S]</sup>Areopagus and said, "Men of Athens, I observe that you are very religious in all respects. <sup>23</sup> For while I was passing through and examining the objects of your worship, I also found an altar with this inscription, 'TO AN UNKNOWN GOD.' [Funny story about that]
- Therefore what you worship in *ignorance*, this I proclaim to you. [*there is only ONE God*]<sup>24</sup> The God who made the world and all things in it, <u>since He is Lord of heaven and earth</u>, does not dwell in temples made with hands; <sup>25</sup> nor is He served by human hands, as though He needed anything, since He Himself gives to all *people* life and breath and all things; [not a demi-urge]

### Sermon on Mars Hill cont

<sup>26</sup> and <u>He made from one *man* every nation</u> of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined their appointed times and the boundaries of their habitation, <sup>27</sup> that they would seek God, if perhaps they might grope for Him and find Him, though He is not far from each one of us; <sup>28</sup> for in Him we live and move and [t]exist, as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we also are His children.'

### Sermon on Mars Hill cont

- <sup>29</sup> Being then the children of God, we ought not to think that the Divine Nature is like gold or silver or stone, an image formed by the art and thought of man. <sup>30</sup> Therefore having <u>overlooked the</u> <u>times of ignorance</u>, God is now declaring to men that all *people* everywhere should repent.
- <sup>31</sup> because He has fixed a day in which He will judge <sup>[u]</sup>the world in righteousness <sup>[Y]</sup>through a Man whom He has appointed, having furnished proof to all men <sup>[W]</sup>by raising Him from the dead."

### Sermon on Mars Hill cont

- <sup>32</sup> Now when they heard of the resurrection of the dead, <u>some *began* to sneer</u>,
- but others said, "We shall hear you again concerning this." (We'll think about it)
- <sup>33</sup> So Paul went out of their midst. <sup>34</sup> But some men joined him and believed, among whom also were <u>Dionysius the Areopagite</u> and a woman named Damaris and others with them.

### Foolish Wisdom

- For the Athenians, religion was a game for entertainment or debate, because for them God(s) was only a benign force at best, and certainly not engaged in any personal way with this world. Life was all intellect and pleasure.
- They laughed at "babblers" like Paul who proclaimed God as Personal, Sovereign, Loving, and Just. It was just inconceivable
- After 600 years of being the smartest guys in the room, their hearts were 2 sizes too small, and their brains were too full of worldly opinions, to be sensitive to, interested in the voice of God

#### So, What Happened in Athens?

- Nothing. As far as we know, Paul never went back and the church didn't start to thrive there until almost 300 years later, after Emperor Constantine's declaration
- Why? Maybe God's timing? Maybe a lack of intercessory support because he was alone? Certainly hearts were harder and minds were completely closed.
- Paul' strategy changed. No Antioch Declaration; instead, he tried the Athenian approach – he appealed to their intellect, tried to reason with them, and it fell flat. The Holy Spirit didn't show up.
- On to Corinth "from now on, I am going to rely only on the Power of the Holy Spirit!!"

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
